

**Student Research Assistant
Local Government and Co-operatives
Centre for the Study of Co-operatives, University of Saskatchewan**

The Centre for the Study of Co-operatives is seeking a student to assist with a research project exploring the area of co-operatives and social cohesion. The main focus of this summer project is to conduct telephone interviews, to transcribe and process the interview data, and to write a report summarizing the results. This project is part of a research proposal recently approved for funding through the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada. The larger project, *Co-operative Membership and Globalization: Creating Social Cohesion through Market Relations*, will examine the relationship between social cohesion and co-operative membership in a variety of settings.

Successful applicants must have excellent research, analytical, and communication skills, both oral and written. The candidate must be able to work independently, follow timelines and meet project expectations. Experience with telephone or in-person interview techniques would be an asset as would a familiarity with co-operative organizations.

This full-time position is open to current or prospective graduate students with the University of Saskatchewan. The position will run for a period of four months from May to August. Rates of pay will be according to university student-assistant salary schedules.

The work will be supervised by Dr Brett Fairbairn, Professor of History and Director of the Centre for the Study of Co-operatives, in consultation with key grant co-investigators and the grant project manager.
